This summer we are taking **all middle school and high school students** back to Crossings. Crossings Ministries is supported by the Kentucky Baptist Convention and has been running camps for nearly 20 years. The ministry exists to proclaim the Gospel and partner with churches to see God transform lives and grow leaders for the glory of Christ. Last year we had a wonderful experience and we're looking forward to another great year of camp.

This summer, the camp theme is "Pursue: Join the Eternal Movement." Jesus faithfully pursues all of us and, in response, those who trust in him humbly pursue Him. He calls us to come and die to ourselves: our agenda, our ambition, our desires, and our sin. He says to all, "If any man desires to be my disciple, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it" (Matthew 16:24-25). This summer, we'll look into the Gospel of Matthew, learn from the lives of Jesus' first disciples, and study a few of Jesus' most powerful sermons. Together, we will hear Jesus' voice and we will obey Jesus' invitation to follow him and be his disciples. All who do this follow in his footsteps, find true life, and thereby join an eternal movement of disciples who pursue the growth of Jesus' kingdom.

Everything is included in the price of camp except for one meal on the way there, one meal on the way back, any spending money students want while at camp, and the missions offering. The Shack and Crossings Café will sell everything from stickers and t-shirts to sodas and lattes.

Mornings = Gospel + Heart Focus

Morning Celebration

A high-energy time every morning that includes live sketches, videos, announcements, games, and music. Morning Cel. ensures the students are awake and ready to study God's Word.

Bible Study



Daily in-depth exposition of God's Word led by the Camp Pastor. After Bible study, students break out into a staffer-led discussion and application small group time.

All Camp Competitive Games



Bible study groups compete against each other in physical, mental, indoor, and outdoor games. At the end of the camp week a champion will be crowned.

Afternoons = High Energy Indoor + Outdoor Activities

Points of Impact (POIs)



These are basically "tracks" that students choose for each day. At the end of each event, staffers spend a few minutes discussing with students how that particular activity illustrates the Gospel.

Students have the opportunity to experience water zip-lines, blobs, water slides, and more. A Lake Rotation is included in every full day of camp!

Connect



This is a designated time for us to gather back together as a church group to connect with our students through devotions, discussions, team building activities, or simply hanging out.

*Points of Impact are basically "tracks" that students can choose and the list of options is impressive: Archery Tag, Bazooka Ball, Escape Rooms, Evangelism/Missions, Improv, Climbing, Disc Golf, Heartsong Worship, Dodgeball, Tiger Ball, Ultimate Frisbee, Fishing, Minute-to-Win-It, Gaga Ball, Hiking, Basketball, Soccer, Smashball, Zip-lines, and more.
